

UMM SCHOLARSHIPS

Connie Maxell Scholarship

A student that is an English major with demonstrated need

Amy Pinkham Scholarship

A student from Hancock County

Hugh Drisko Scholarship

A male student in an Education program currently enrolled in the sophomore year who is a Washington County resident

Adelaide & Charles Kilton Scholarship

A deserving UMM student who is a Washington County resident (E. Machias or Machias preferred) in an education program who has completed one year

Vonetta C. Smith Scholarship

A western Washington County student who is an education major

Gladys Wilbur Scholarship

A student from the Pembroke area (preferred residence in Pembroke, Charlotte, Dennysville or Perry)

Edna Higgins Scholarship

A student from the greater Portland area (preferred residence in Portland, South Portland, Westbrook, Cumberland, Falmouth, Gorham, Cape Elizabeth, or Scarborough)

Percy & Francis Allen Scholarship

A Washington County student in Teacher Education

Lincoln & Alice Sennett Memorial Scholarship

Highest ranking third-year student training to become a teacher

Norman W. Duzen Scholarship

Student majoring in history, academically outstanding, full-time sophomore or junior. Priority to students planning to teach and who reside in Washington County

Rebecca H. Perry Scholarship

A scholarship established in the name of the donor who had a long career in the field of education in Maine and who was a member of the D.A.R. Hannah Weston Chapter in Machias. Given to a deserving student.

W. Allan McCracken Scholarship Fund

Scholarship given to one student each from a Washington County high school (preference to Calais High School) and from a Charlotte County, New Brunswick high school (preference to Sir James Dunn Academy). Awards will first be made to students majoring in education.

Joseph D. Fahey Scholarship

A scholarship established in the memory of the donor and to be awarded to a deserving student attending UMM

Frederic A. and Norma P. Reynolds Scholarship

Scholarship to a deserving student graduating from a Washington County high school preparing to become a teacher.

St. Croix Valley Merit Scholarship for Women

The scholarship is given to a woman enrolled in a four-year science or education program at UMM with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or better. She must be age 18 to 24 at the time of the award. First priority is to students who are residents of Alexander, Robbinston or Pembroke.

Dr. Philmore and Dorothy Wass Education Scholarship

Annual (not endowed) scholarship for a student in education

Buford L. and Alice B. Grant Scholarship

A deserving UMM student

Ethel Billie Wilson Gammon Scholarship

The Gammon Scholarship was established by Ethel Billie Gammon, a graduate of UMM and instrumental in creating Norlands Living History Center, and has dedicated her professional life to the preservation of Maine and its history and to the humanities. The scholarship is awarded to a history or education major with a significant interest in history

Lighthouse Keepers Memorial Scholarship

The Lighthouse Keepers Memorial Scholarship was established in honor of Hervey H. and Mabel C. Wass who served on Maine's island light stations. The award is made to a successful student entering a second year of a four-year program

Nathan Turk Memorial Scholarship

A UMM student who exemplifies the pride of UMM and the spirit Nathan brought to campus and community

Robert B. Maxell Scholarship

Awarded to a full-time student completing the sophomore year, who has a demonstrated need for financial assistance, and a graduate of a secondary school in Washington or Aroostook counties

Jack Armstrong Behavioral Science Award

Annual award to an outstanding behavioral science student who will be returning to UMM the following year. Selection of recipient shall be made by the UMM Scholarship Committee based on faculty recommendation if available

Arthur & Francis Buswell Scholarship

Offered to full-time students enrolled in baccalaureate degree programs focusing on the natural sciences. Given to serious students maintaining a GPA of 3.0 or higher, who demonstrate leadership, academic promise and campus involvement. Financial need may be considered.

John J. Joseph Memorial Scholarship

Annual awards to students in one of the natural science programs. Preference to traditional-age students. Recipient(s) must have a GPA of 3.5. Awards should be split equitably between in-state and out-of-state students. If only one award available in a year, award the most deserving student regardless of residence.

The Elsie A. and Richard C. Larson Scholarship

Annual scholarships offered to full-time, baccalaureate degree students enrolled in any business-related program(s), achieved at least 55-60 credits, a minimum of 30 of those credits earned at UMM. A 3.2 GPA required. Preference to students who have an interest and ability in music and/or athletics.

Blanche S. Palmer Memorial Scholarship

In memory of Blanche S. Palmer, this scholarship is given to recipients who demonstrate academic merit, professional promise and financial need

Nathan C. and Dorothy W. Burbank Scholarship

One or more scholarships to student(s) on the basis of academic merit and financial need. (Mr. Burbank was a public health engineer who worked in Washington and Hancock counties)

Augustus Ward Young Scholarship

Ruth Agnes Young Scholarship

Two endowments, two scholarships, same criteria: awards to be made to juniors and seniors, residents of Washington County, Maine or Charlotte County, N.B. Parents, grandparents, or great-grandparents must have been a member of East Star for at least five years. Preference to students studying marine biology, biology, or education. Recipients must demonstrate character and discipline, have financial need and expected academic success.

Bath Iron Works Scholarship

Is offered to employees and their children to provide aid to needy undergraduate students in good academic standing

Sunrise Senior College Award

Made to a graduating senior at the beginning of the academic year of graduation. The recipient must be 50 year old or more, be in a four-year program and a legal resident of Washington County
